- I do not see stair drawn from third floor down to ground level. Verify if there is a stairway that exists for 3rd and 2nd level to ground floor. Photos of the existing deck would be helpful.- No stairs necessary from 2nd and 3rd floors. None in existence now.
- 8. Provide opening limitations of railings.- 4"
