CONSENT AGREEMENT

The parties, the City of Portland (the "City") and Keith Welch and Linda Rose Welch (together "Owners") hereby enter into this Consent Agreement as follows:

WHEREAS, Owners own a multi-unit residential property located at 89 Vesper Street in Portland, Maine, shown as CBL 003 D012001 on the City of Portland Tax Maps (the "Property");

WHEREAS, the City of Portland Fire Department ("PFD") inspected the Property on September 26, 2016 (the "First Inspection Date");

WHEREAS, Owners were notified of certain fire and life safety code violations at the Property in a Notice of Violation dated October 5, 2016 ("NOV I");

WHEREAS, Owners agreed to remedy the violations described in NOV I (the "Violations") by the dates indicated in their plan of action, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit A;

WHEREAS, Owners still have not remedied the Violations and have requested an extension of time to do so;

WHEREAS, the City is willing to grant an extension of time; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to settle this matter between them, and provide a date by which Owners will have fully remedied all of the outstanding Violations at the Property.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree to the following:

- 1. Owners will have all Violations corrected no later than December 31, 2017 (the "Compliance Date").
- The Violations shall be remedied in full compliance with the City of Portland Code of
 Ordinance and other applicable laws, and shall be remedied to the full satisfaction of
 the relevant City of Portland official.
- 3. Owners will schedule reinspection of the Property on or before the Compliance Date.

- 4. If Owners fail to comply with any provision of this Agreement within the timeframe provided, Owners shall pay to the City of Portland civil penalties in the amount \$46,100, which amounts to \$100 per day from the Inspection Date until the Compliance Date.
- 5. Owners further agree to pay to the City additional civil penalties in the amount of \$100 per day beyond the Compliance Date that the Violations are not remedied.
- 6. They City may grant an extension of the deadlines in this Agreement in its sole discretion, if Owners request the extension in advance and demonstrate good cause for the extension.

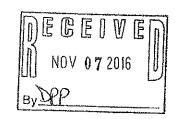
