I believe these revised plans provide the information requested for the Level I Minor Development Review Application. Is it required that I re-submit the previous unchanged set of drawings as well?

I have checked off all of the Applicant checklist items that are applicable to the project. Some questions / comments I have to unchecked items are:

- 1. Am I required to provide the multiple copies as noted or will the submitted PDF's be distributed as necessary?
- 2. State and Federal permits: I do not believe we require any.
- 3. Description of easements or other burdens: There are no easements on the property that I am aware of. If there were, the boundary survey would have indicated them.
- 4. Request for waiver from site plan or technical standards: I'm not certain if this is applicable.
- 5. Written summary of fire safety: I will forward the permit set to the Fire Department today along with answers to the 7 questions on the checklist.
- 6. A foundation perimeter drain outlet is not feasible and considering that the first floor is on a slab we don't feel it is necessary.
