Please see Sec. 1003.5 Elevation Change, for changes less than 12", if the ramp is greater than 1:20 and 6" or less, either handrails or contrasting floor finish materials is required.

What are the red rectangular marks? Is this the same change on the other side? If so the same details are required.

We will make the ramped areas a contrasting floor color. We will make sure all ramps without handrails have a contrasting floor color.

The red marks are where we are removing the old stair to the third floor which is abandoned and will have on access stair.
