Hi Ann,

I received a street status request from Tom Jewel, Esq. this morning in regards to Wilmot Court which is located at #46 Wilmot Street. He was concerned that permits were not being issued due to the uncertain status of Wilmot Court, so I have adjusted my schedule to provide information.

Wilmot Court is not a City accepted street and is not listed as a paper street.

It is my opinion that Wilmot Court (which is more like an alley than a traveled way) may have been named (by persons unknown) in order to provide a named location for emergency service vehicles and others to respond to. Wilmot Court provides access to Wilmot Street from apartment entrances along the southeasterly side of the apartment building at #48 Wilmot Street.

I have attached the Street Status Card I prepared for Wilmot Court. I have also attached the plan which shows Wilmot Court as Wilmot Place in 1919.

Tom mentioned that he submitted a copy of a Mortgage Loan Inspection to Assessing, which would be helpful in my file for the Private Way in case someone gets asked about Wilmot Court in the future.
