I checked out the stairwell and related signage in question and here is what I f	found.
On the basement floor of the stairwell, there is an exit sign that is suggesting of 7 Custom House, rather than using the egress that is through 300 Fore Street. outside the stairwell in the 7 Custom House building side.	

On the second floor, there is an exit sign above the door leading from the 2nd Floor 300 Fore Street side and one above the door leading from 7 Custom House Street side.

Thanks for the email...

Regarding Jeanie's inquires on the shared stair on the plan east side of the Life Safety drawings, the stair and corridors in question are outside this project scope. That said, Anthony forwarded everyone some notes and pictures of the existing conditions. It appears that those spaces are common core areas separate of CIEE's space and have existing exist signs.

Regarding the inquiry on the egress discharge exception 1.2. This issue is regarding 2009 IBC 1027 that requires "The entire area of the level of exit discharge is separated from areas below by construction conforming to the fire-resistance rating for the exit enclosure." Then for reference, per 2009 IBC 1022, "Exit enclosures shall have a fire-resistance rating of not less than 2 hours where connecting four stories or more...". We have reviewed the level below the proposed exit discharge on as-built drawings and the existing ceiling / floor assembly was constructed per UL D216 which has an applicable 2 hour rating. Therefore the basement areas that are to undergo construction / modifications should be reconstructed with a UL D216-2 hour rated assembly.

FRJS refers to "Fire Rated Joint System". We do not normally detail these areas because there are usually specific proprietary materials that have been used in the tested assembly.
