#### **Conditions:**

- 1) The entire sprinkler system shall be maintained in accordance with NFPA 25, Standard for Inspection, Testing and Maintenance of Water-Based Fire Protection Systems, 2008 edition. The sprinkler inspection report indicated the required obstruction investigation was not performed and the fire pump flow test indicated the automatic transfer switch test was not performed. Both items shall be completed prior to the final inspection with documentation provided to the fire inspector.
- 2) A separate Fire Alarm Permit is required for new systems; or for work effecting more than 5 fire alarm devices; or replacement of a fire alarm panel with a different model. This review does not include approval of fire alarm system design or installation.
- 3) A separate Suppression System Permit is required for all new suppression systems, including standpipe systems, and sprinkler work effecting more than 20 heads. This review does not include approval of system design or installation.
- 4) A Class K fire extinguisher is required for the kitchen.
- 5) All means of egress to remain accessible at all times.
- 6) Emergency lights and exit signs are required. Emergency lights and exit signs are required to be labeled in relation to the panel and circuit and on the same circuit as the lighting for the area they serve.
- 7) Any cutting and welding done will require a Hot Work Permit from Fire Department.
- 8) Construction or installation shall comply with City Code Chapter 10.
- 9) \*\*A current inspection sticker and fire alarm instection and test report from an approved fire alarm inspection company is required prior to the final inspection.\*\*
- 10 Per the building rep a new hood will be installed and connected to an existing ventilation system. The Type I commercial hood and hood suppression systems shall be installed in accordance with NFPA 96. A separate permit is required for both systems. An HVAC engineer shall inspect the existing ventilation and make up air for sufficiency and stamp all plans. This permit does not indicate review or approval of systems design or installation.
- 11 The approved plans with the Building Department Approved stamp shall be maintained on site for inspection.

- 12 Notice: The first scheduled final inspection fee is at no charge. Additional inspections shall be billed at \$75 for each inspector.
- 13 Through-penetrations and membrane penetrations in fire walls, fire barrier walls, and fire resistance rated horizontal assemblies shall be protected by firestop systems or devices in conformance with NFPA 101:8.3.5 (ASTM E 814 or ANSI/UL 1479). Providing firestop labels at each firestop system or device and an onsite manual containing the detail for each firestop system or device used for the project will streamline final inspection approvals.
