1) The installation shall comply with the following:

City of Portland Chapter 10, Fire Prevention and Protection;

NFPA 1, Fire Code (2009 edition), as amended by City Code;

NFPA 101, Life Safety Code (2009 edition), as amended by City Code;

City of Portland Fire Department Rules and Regulations;

NFPA 72, National Fire Alarm and Signaling Code as amended by Fire Department Rules and Regulations; and

NFPA 70, National Electrical Code as amended by the State of Maine.

NFPA 70E Standard For Electrical Safety Requirements For Employee Workplaces

NFPA 75 Standard For the Protection of Electronic Computer/Data Processing Equipment

All smoke detectors shall be photoelectric.

Supervising Station monitoring for addressable fire alarm systems shall be by point.

Annunciator(s) and pull stations shall be keyed alike.

Through-penetrations and membrane penetrations in fire walls, fire barrier walls, and fire resistance rated horizontal assemblies shall be protected by firestop systems or devices in conformance with NFPA 101:8.3.5 (ASTM E 814 or ANSI/UL 1479).

Providing firestop labels at each firestop system or device and an onsite manual containing the detail for each firestop system or device used for the project will streamline final inspection approvals.

All fire alarm records required by NFPA 72 should be stored in an approved cabinet located at the FACP labeled "FIRE ALARM RECORDS".

The Remote Annunciator(ANN) shall be located in the main entrance on the address side of the building.

The fire alarm system shall be certified by a master fire alarm company and have a new fire alarm inspection sticker.

Notice: The first scheduled final inspection fee is at no charge. Additional inspections shall be billed at \$150 for each inspector.

A 3200 series hinged Knox Box is required. 2 sets of master keys are required for access to all spaces of entire building.

System acceptance and commissioning must be coordinated with alarm and suppression system contractors and the Fire Department. Call 874-8700 to schedule.

The approved plans with the Building Department Approved stamp shall be maintained on site for inspection.
