1.3 PROJECT INFORMATION

- A. Project Identification: Interior Renovations for West Program at Portland Public Schools Downtown Facility.
 - 1. Project Location: 26 Portland Street, Portland, ME.
- B. Owner: Portland Public Schools.

1.4 WORK COVERED BY CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- A. The Work of Project is defined by the Contract Documents and consists of the following:
 - 1. The work under this contract is to provide materials and labor for the therapy model educational program planned to occupy the ground floor of the PPS Downtown Facility, including selective demolition, cutting, patching, painting, HVAC, plumbing, electrical, sprinkler revisions, CMU walls, ceilings, walls,

flooring, finishes, doors/hardware, and related work. The work is a renovation of an existing building, no site work involved.

1.5 WORK BY OWNER

- A. General: Cooperate fully with Owner so work may be carried out smoothly, without interfering with or delaying work under this Contract or work by Owner. Coordinate the Work of this Contract with work performed by Owner.
- B. Concurrent Work: Owner will perform the following construction operations at Project site. Those operations will be conducted simultaneously with work under this Contract.
 - 1. Removal of Mechanical Room Doors. Coordinate removal work with installation of new doors to reduce the time the Mechanical Rooms will be without fire rated doors.
- C. Dumpsters and waste removal will be by Owner.
- D. Cost of City of Portland building permit will be by Owner.

1.6 OWNER-FURNISHED PRODUCTS

A. Owner will furnish products indicated. The Work includes receiving, unloading, handling, storing, protecting, and installing Owner-furnished products and making building services connections.

B. Owner-Furnished Products:

- 1. Selected Door Hardware: Refer to Section 087100.
- 2. Selected Door Tempered Glass
- 3. Selected Toilet Accessories: Refer to Section 102800.
- 4. Marker and tack boards
- 5. Quiet Room plywood wall finish.
- 6. Kitchen equipment and appliances

1.7 ACCESS TO SITE

- A. Use of Site: Limit use of Project site to areas within the Contract limits indicated. Do not disturb portions of Project site beyond areas in which the Work is indicated.
- B. Condition of Existing Building: Maintain portions of existing building affected by construction operations in a weathertight condition throughout construction period. Repair damage caused by construction operations.

1.8 COORDINATION WITH OCCUPANTS

A. Full Owner Occupancy: Owner will occupy site and existing building during entire construction period. Cooperate with Owner during construction operations to minimize conflicts and

facilitate Owner usage. Perform the Work so as not to interfere with Owner's day-to-day operations. Maintain existing exits unless otherwise indicated.

- 1. Maintain access to existing walkways, corridors, and other adjacent occupied or used facilities. Do not close or obstruct walkways, corridors, or other occupied or used facilities without written permission from Owner and approval of authorities having jurisdiction.
- 2. Notify Owner not less than 72 hours in advance of activities that will affect Owner's operations.

1.9 WORK RESTRICTIONS

- A. Work Restrictions, General: Comply with restrictions on construction operations.
 - 1. Comply with limitations on use of public streets and with other requirements of authorities having jurisdiction.
- B. On-Site Work Hours: Work shall be generally performed during normal business working hours of 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., seven days a week, except holidays.
 - 1. Hours for Utility Shutdowns: As approved by Architect and Owner.
 - 2. Provide 24 hour notice to Architect when performing work other than normal working hours.
- C. Existing Utility Interruptions: Do not interrupt utilities serving facilities occupied by Owner or others unless permitted under the following conditions and then only after providing temporary utility services according to requirements indicated:
 - 1. Notify Architect not less than two days in advance of proposed utility interruptions.
 - 2. Obtain Architect's written permission before proceeding with utility interruptions.
- D. Noise, Vibration, and Odors: Coordinate operations that may result in high levels of noise and vibration, odors, or other disruption to Owner occupancy with Owner.
 - 1. Notify Architect not less than two days in advance of proposed disruptive operations.
 - 2. Obtain Architect's written permission before proceeding with disruptive operations.
- E. Nonsmoking Building: Smoking is not permitted within the building or within 25 feet of entrances, operable windows, or outdoor-air intakes.
- F. Drugs, Alcohol, Substance Abuses, and Firearms: It is strictly prohibited to posses, use, conceal, transport, traffic any drugs, alcohol, controlled substances, or firearms on the premises of the School. Any violations shall be grounds for dismissal and may be cause for termination of any contracts or portions thereof.
- G. Fraternization: Personnel associated with the Construction project shall not associate in any way with the students, faculty, or staff at the school. The General Contractor shall limit access of employees to the project site and to the approved access routes. In addition to fraternization, the use of vulgar language or obscene gestures shall be grounds for immediate dismissal from this project.

1.10 SPECIFICATION AND DRAWING CONVENTIONS

- A. Specification Content: The Specifications use certain conventions for the style of language and the intended meaning of certain terms, words, and phrases when used in particular situations. These conventions are as follows:
 - 1. Imperative mood and streamlined language are generally used in the Specifications. The words "shall," "shall be," or "shall comply with," depending on the context, are implied where a colon (:) is used within a sentence or phrase.
 - 2. Specification requirements are to be performed by Contractor unless specifically stated otherwise.
- B. Division 01 General Requirements: Requirements of Sections in Division 01 apply to the Work of all Sections in the Specifications.
- C. Drawing Coordination: Requirements for materials and products identified on Drawings are described in detail in the Specifications. One or more of the following are used on Drawings to identify materials and products:
 - 1. Terminology: Materials and products are identified by the typical generic terms used in the individual Specifications Sections.
 - 2. Abbreviations: Materials and products are identified by abbreviations published as part of the U.S. National CAD Standard and scheduled on Drawings.
 - 3. Keynoting: Materials and products are identified by reference keynotes referencing Specification Section numbers found in this Project Manual.
