After looking at your submission for 415 Cumberland Avenue, we've determined we need additional / updated materials. We will need to receive these before we can formally review or provide comments about your proposed project. Please provide:

Boundary Plan stamped by Maine Licensed Surveyor

Subdivision Plat stamped by Maine Licensed Surveyor and meeting regulations for recording plat

Site Plan stamped by a Maine Licensed Engineer and addressing the site plan requirements

Please refer to the Subdivision Ordinance and Site Plan Ordinance in the City's Land Use Code for specific requirements of the Subdivision Plan and Site Plan.

ADA Narrative confirming how the proposals meet ADA requirements

Without getting into formal comments, I also want to acknowledge that there seem to be some missing labels and/or mislabeled information on the plans you submitted. Some items that need attention / clarity include:

* there is a walkway crossing the sidewalk near the front entrance of the building, the purpose of which is unclear. (Are these to bicycle hitches? If so, the hitches are unlabeled)

* location of the trash

- * access easement for the YMCA
- * allocation and management of parking

* uses of commercial space

* use of deck space (is this unit part of the unit below, which is labeled a 2 bedroom?) * traffic signal pole misidentified as light pole

- * existing street trees on Cumberland and Forest Avenues
- * gate off Forest Avenue access/ egress / placement /details do not appear on site plan

I also strongly suggest that you take advantage of a pre-application-style Permitting and Inspections meeting with Jason Grant for code review, to make sure early on that your proposed uses and plans do not need to be changed later.
