Thanks so much for working through this with us and for your patience as we've run this by some folks here.

Given that that this is a heavily used pedestrian corridor; that Forest Ave is a densely traveled roadway; that you will be reconstructing entire sections of the sidewalk; that there are street trees and street lights that create choke points within the existing sidewalk; and that we would like some separation for pedestrians from overhead work, please use Jersey barriers to create a 42" pedestrian walkway immediately adjacent to the existing sidewalk along Forest Ave for the duration of exterior work (as shown, but narrower than on your original CMP attached). Please also provide a bituminous ramp to allow ADA access to this pedestrian corridor, as shown on your original CMP. This narrower pedestrian corridor will provide sufficient lane width for larger vehicles travelling southeast along Forest Avenue, alleviating the original concern expressed during the pre-construction meeting.

This will allow your team to access the full width of the sidewalk for staging, lifts, and materials as needed.

I am not allowed to approve TCP/CMP, That would be others to do, including Jeremiah who I have included in my response. but I have concerns approaching the intersection of Forest and Cumberland and using the sidewalk access ramp.

I don't want pedestrians walling around the manlift. If you look at the attached google image, you will see there is not a lot of sidewalk real estate there for an 8'x8' manlift, mast pole and the slope of the ADA panel.

Watching pedestrians walk this, I don't see many issues walking on Forest Ave providing the Jacks /guardrail system allow an unobstructed 4 feet at the footprint and has reflective/visible tape on the setup.

I do have concerns rounding the corner. The first is visibility and the second is walking from Cumberland Ave going to Forest Ave. People naturally hug the building side of the sidewalk and with me just standing at the corner, people walked into the street than stepped back onto the sidewalk on Forest Ave at the tree well. It was scary for me to watch. A lot of vehicle movement at this intersection.



HI All,

I have altered our construction management plan as follows. We would like to propose the following:

- -We will be installing jersey barriers along the building on Forest Ave creating a 42" walkway between the curb and the barrier. A HC ramp that allows ADA access will be installed. (previously approved)
- The area in the front of the building on Cumberland Ave. will be occupied by a man lift. The sidewalk will be closed to pedestrians. Signage will be placed on the corners of Cumberland Ave and High Street as well as the NE corner of Cumberland Ave and Forest Ave. The signs will direct the pedestrians to cross the street at the existing crosswalks and tip downs, safely avoiding the work area on Cumberland Ave.

I have included the previously approved construction management plans (with revisions) as well as a plan indicating the path of the pedestrians for clarity.

Please review and let me know your thoughts on this revised plan so that we can implement it as quickly as possible.

A meeting has been set for Tuesday October 9th at 1:30 for further discussion if need be.
