# **HVAC / Power Equipment Application & Checklist**

All of the following information is required and must be submitted. Checking off each item as you prepare your application package will ensure your package is complete and will help to expedite the permitting process.

#### Is this an EXACT replacement? (ie: SAME PRODUCT in the SAME LOCATION?)

If so, you do NOT need to provide any plans, etc, just the application form. (NOTE: a final inspection is still a requirement)

	where the equipment is going to be installed.
$\checkmark$	Information on how the unit is being vented & hanging details if appropriate.
<b>/</b>	Details of the specific equipment being installed; ie; specifications and any heating technical specifications. (Often this information can be obtained from the manufacturer's spec sheet or retail advertisements.)
	A plot plan showing the shape and dimension of the lot, with the distance from the actual property lines, and the principal structure, or structures, may be required if venting to the outside.
<b>✓</b>	Proof of ownership is required if it is inconsistent with the assessors records.
<b>✓</b>	All documents as individual PDFs and named appropriately
* All HIVAC installations shall comply with applicable state and local codes *

Separate permits are required for plumbing and electrical installations, as required.

Separate permits are also required based on different properties (Different Chart, Block and Lot.)

**Permit Fee:** \$25.00 for the first \$1000.00 construction cost, \$11.00 per additional \$1000.00 cost

This is not a Permit; you may not commence any work until the Permit is issued.

### Electronic Signature and Fee Payment Confirmation

Within 24-48 hours, upon receipt of an e-mailed invoice from Building Inspections, which signifies that my electronic permit application and corresponding paperwork have been received, determined complete, entered by an administrative representative, and assigned a permit number, I then have the following four (4) payment options: provide an on-line electronic check or credit/debit card (we now accept American Express, Discover, VISA, and MasterCard) payment (along with applicable fees beginning July 1, 2014), call the Inspections Office at (207) 874-8703 and speak to an administrative representative to provide a credit/debit card payment over the phone, hand-deliver a payment method to the Inspections Office, Room 315, Portland City Hall, deliver a payment method through the U.S. Postal Service, at the following address: City of Portland, Inspections Division 389 Congress Street, Room 315 Portland, Maine 04101 Once my payment has been received, this then starts the review process of my permit. After all

approvals have been met and completed, I will then be issued my permit via e-mail. No work shall be started until I have received my permit.
