David: thanks for coming by, also appreciate the professional advice. Only remaining issue: doors. I would like to have until 2/1/17 to present a specific action plan on the 5 doors that separate living space from common area. You educated me that this involves the 4 edges of the door, the self closing feature and the 1 hour rating. I will research with Chuck Noble and other sources. Right now it appears likely the 1 and 5/8 wood plus the expensive fire paint brings it up to at least an hour but I will document that. We want to do no more nor no less than all the other multi's in Portland, to be honest I'll having trouble finding many fire type doors anywhere.

I want to repeat that our attic is open unfinished as built. Assume you asked that because there are so many illegal units around. We are just the opposite, we were a legal 5, when we moved here ,we combined the 2 first floor units, thus a 4 now.

We plan to have 4 hard wire battery backup smoke alarms installed by 10/1/08 outside the sleeping area of each apartment. This is a 4 unit owner occupied building.

We anticipate a \$9000. oil heat bill this coming winter and property taxes are due in Sept. so we do not see any funds that will be available for the removal of our heavy original apt. doors in our circa 1830 home. I walked the neighborhood and I could not find any metal doors in similar historic multi unit buildings.

I might suggest that an initial letter from the city need not carry threats of summons, court, fines, attorneys ...costs etc...

As I told you the city refused to enforce a situation next door to us for three years and they would not respond as to why - we find the timing of the 7/3/08 very strange since we have owned this property for over 20 years.

We will have documentation from an electrician re: smoke alarms prior to 10/1/.2008.



Chuck Noble is no help to the average homeowner as far as I can tell, he does sell intumescent stripes costing \$835. per door, not practical other than it legitimizes their use which is common in the UK. Gutting doors and frames out is not practical either and we don't see anyone doing that. I'll need until 5/1/17 to complete the attached action plan.

ACTION PLAN Re: DOORS 164 Danforth St, Portland, Me.

5 doors that separate common area from living space.

- (1) apt #3, have already replaced the hollow core wood door with custom metal door with 2 self closing hinges. Top, sides and bottom will have HARD WOOD stripes to close any gap down to 1/8 max. Stripes will have two coats of the same intumescent paint as our wood doors that you have already signed off on.
- (2) Four other 1 5/8 original heavy doors already have 2 coats of intumescent paint and the same hard wood stripes as apt. #3 will be used. We are replacing any soft wood stripes already installed as research shows hardwood is the acceptable material. Care will be taken to make all stripes tight on the top, sides and bottom. These four doors will have 2 self closing hinges as well
