- 1) What is the approximate distance between the two back legs of the sign (i.e what is the spread at the back of the triangle)?
- 2) What will the setback be from the property line to the front leg of the sign? Based on the submitted survey plan, it looks to be somewhere between 4 and 5 feet. Please be aware that signs must be set back at least 5 feet from the property line.
