To Whom It May Concern,

I live in the carriage house at 11 Mellen Street. I was awakened at 4:43AM today by a forklift unloading a tractor trailer truck and placing the materials into a large metal storage container. In addition to that noise, other men engaged in the work were yelling to one another. This activity persisted until perhaps 6AM and I could hear it despite using earplugs.

On Monday, June 6, I was awakened at approximately the same time, 4:46AM, by the sound of glass breaking in the recently placed large dumpster. That day I spoke with a Rite Aid manager about the noise and he instructed me to speak personally with the contractors that evening. When I returned that evening to do so, I was directed to speak with a night manager. This gentleman, though he did not apologize, informed me that the work would proceed quietly going forward.

I have not yet bothered to waste more of my time by researching my rights in this situation. However, if I am awakened again by noise from your construction, I will pursue every available legal remedy to ensure that your project ceases until it proceeds respectfully or during normal business hours.

Rite Aid is performing its renovation at night in order to maintain its daytime 'business as usual.' For me, business as usual means that I can sleep through the night. If I cannot go about my business as usual, Rite Aid will not either.
