Dear Shalom, Laura, Chriss and Kris:

(Sorry for getting this out to you so late... I know that you have been working on many of the items below.)

This will acknowledge receipt of your proposal requesting permission to hold the 1st Annual Festival of Nations (a festival showcasing Maine's ethnic diversity) on Saturday, July 26, 2003, at Deering Oaks Park, 2pm - 8:30pm (set up for the event starts at 9am / clean up ends at 10pm). There will be music, dance, games, facepainting, food vendors, crafts and clothing vendors, cultural exhibits, a health fair, and booths from participating organizations. The festival will be centered around the bandstand area. Tables and chairs will be set up, a number of booths, and 2 large tents set up on the grass. For the stage: musical instruments and a pa system will be set up (electricity is needed). There will be no alcohol or beer sales/drinking at the park. Attendance is expected at 200 - 500 people (all ages). There is no rain date.

Portland Parks & Recreation is a co-sponsor of the festival (there is no park permit fee being charged) and Parks & Recreation staff will be assisting on some levels. Friends of Deering Oaks has also agreed to co-sponsor the event.

Please be advised that you are authorized to hold the 1st Annual Festival of Nations at Decring Oaks Park, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. CERT. OF INSURANCE / PARK SECURITY DEPOSIT: Please ask your insurance company to fax P&R a certificate of insurance naming the City of Portland as additional insured in regards to your event (coverage at least \$400,000 general liability). The P&R fax #: 756-8279. Please forward a \$250 park security deposit (check payable to City of Portland) to this office. Please remember that you will get back your security deposit only if the area is left as was found. Monies may be deducted from the security deposit for clean up, repair of grounds, non-compliance with the conditions for use, etc. Please make sure that all vehicles stay off grass areas and park only in designated parking areas. Parks & Recreation has a strict policy that prohibits vehicles parking on the grass areas. For each vehicle parked on grass, \$10 will be deducted from your security deposits. Please make sure you adhere to this policy.
- 2. CTTY CLERKS LICENSES: You have permission to invited food vendors into the park. For refreshments and food at the site, please call Brandi Maxwell (874-8557) at the City Clerks Office to receive a temporary food service license. All food vendors must be licensed. Please procure a concert license from her as well (for the music at the stage). Please remember to keep volume levels of your pa system down to a minimum. If the police department receives noise complaints they will respond accordingly. AG Ice Cream currently has a contract with Parks & Recreation and their ice cream trucks are allowed into the park (they will probably park on Tennis Ct. Road or somewhere near the old Barking Squirrel). For arts & crafts, t-shirts, cd's, etc. to be sold at the park, please procure a street goods vendors license from Brandi.
- 3. USE OF THE BANDSTAND / PARKING OF VEHICLES: There is a driveway which leads down to the bandstand. We require that all vehicles stay to tarred areas and not drive or park on any of the grass portions. (The only vehicle that has permission to drive across the grass is the truck which has the pa gear inside. It can drive down the Bandstand driveway and then cross over the grass to park on the tarred area in front of the bandstand to unload and

load only. Once finished, the truck must legally park ensewhere in the park.) The value of the bandstand driveway to unload (and load). Once items are dropped off at the bandstand, we require that vehicles move out again on to the park roadway (parking available on one side of Tennis Court Road); there should be no vehicles parking on the Bandstand Roadway/Farmer's Market Roadway. There is also a dirt parking lot located near the old Barking Squirrel Restaurant and parking may be available at King Middle School, across the street from Deering Oaks.

- 4. FARMERS MARKET: As you know, Farmers Market will be in the Oaks until around 1pm 2pm. If it's a nice day, they take up pretty much all of Farmers Market Roadway almost down to the Bandstand. Please do no interfere with their sales or setup/exit. The park road parallel to Decring Ave. (where people visiting the farmers sometimes park) will be locked and closed to the public at 1pm. If you setup vendors on the Farmers Market roadway (near the bandstand), make sure their displays/booths, etc. are only on one side of the road keep most of the roadway clear, as sometimes farmers will exit the park in this direction. Hopefully, you have spoken to many of the farmers yourself to let them know about your festival and how it might impact them on Saturday.
- 5. BOOTH SET UP / EMERGENCY ACCESS: Please make sure that booths (if setting up in the roadway) leave an emergency access lame of at least 15 feet wide. For vendors setting up their booths and tables, etc., they must not drive on the grass. They can park on the roadway (or bandstand driveway) and walk tables over to their site.
- 6. RESERVING PARKING SPACES (FOR VENDORS, ETC.): Please speak with the park ranger on duty in the morning hours when you arrive to let them know what you are doing regarding the following: You may (if you wish) reserve the Tennis Court Rd. for your volunteers, vendors, band members, etc.. This would be accomplished by putting up barricades across the main entrance to the park (at Deering Ave.). You would need 6 barricades to do this. And this could only be done after 1pm (after farmers market closes and the farmers market vendors have exited the park). You could leave the park road parallel to Deering Ave. open until the left side of that road filled up with vehicles, then you would close that off as well. If you decide to go this route, you will need to position a qualified adult from your organization at the Deering Ave. barricades this person would be needed to let those folks through that were part of your event. Park Rangers will drop off the barricades in the morning hours and will assist your volunteer at the barricades.

If you don't want to go this route, you also have permission to reserve some parking spaces in the park. You can do this 2 ways: with barricades and yellow caution tape (spread out on Tennis Court Road).... Or you may want to set aside all of the dirt parking lot beside the old Barking Squirrel (you can do this with barricades as well). If you reserve the lot, you should consider posting an adult volunteer at the entrances to let only "Festival of Nations" volunteers/vendors in there.

Please call up Marie Sweatt, 756-8275 vm204, at Parks & Recreation, to inform her of what you'd like to do and to request the number of barricades you need (and where they should be dropped). If you need caution tape, I can give you some. Please let me know (and also remember to speak with the park ranger on duty that morning to brief them on what route you're taking to reserve spots in the park).

7. ELECTRICITY / CITY ELECTRICIAN / KEY DEPOSIT / LIGHTS: There is a key which unlocks the storage room at the back of the old bandstand (Kris Clark has already picked up this key and left a \$50 security deposit). You will want to use the electrical outlets in this room as well as the outlets on the exterior of the bandstand - as sometimes the exterior outlets short out easily (bring along a 100 foot 'heavy duty extension cord). The cord fits underneath the door so that the door may be closed (and locked) at all times. The breaker box is also located in the storage room. (A \$50 security deposit is required for the key - which I already have). The key needs to be returned to the P&R Office, 276 Canco Rd., on Monday, July 28. I met Dan from AV Advantage a few days ago at the bandstand and we checked out electricity. There are already existing twist-lock plags there at the bleaker box (and they are tied directly to the breaker box). If Dan is planning on using these, he must first be ok'ed by our City Electrician (Mike Menario) through his supervisors: Emmett Mead or Bob Leeman: 874-8892 or 8895. Please call to arrange a time to meet him there to go over this. There will be no charge if he is just talking to you about what's required by code, etc.

For additional electricity: there are also outlets (4) located on the exterior of the green transformer box (hidden behind evergreens) across the road from the bandstand. You may use those as well (these will come in handy for food or other vendors set up on the roadway or grass area away from the bandstand). These outlets are ground fault protected. As night draws near, you may need light on the stage. There are 2 lights above the bandstand stage. The switches are located beside the breaker box (make sure these are turned off at the end of the night).

All cords in the public way must be covered by rugs or other materials so as to alleviate the tripping hazard to the public. If it were raining or drizzly out, we require that you not use the outlets. There is a broom and a squeegee in the back of the bandstand (in case you need to sweep up or push water off the floor of the bandstand).

8. TENTS: Linux and I have talked about the placement of the 2 large tents (one will go over to the left of the bandstand driveway and the other is slated for the far right of the bandstand in amongst the trees): (If you only go with one tent at either of these locations — that's fine). These 2 tents must be permitted by Inspection Services, Karen Dumfey, 874-8701. Karen will need a site map. To make sure those grass areas have no utilities underground, you must call DIG SAFE; 1-888-344-7233. You'll need to mark out the tent areas in the near future (please use spray-on chalk). You may place small 10x10 canopies anywhere on the grass areas. These small canopies do not need a tent permit. Please make sure that all tent ropes (and the stakes) are clearly marked so the public does not run into them. As WPOR is holding their event at the park on Sunday (setup early Sunday morning), all tents, canopies, etc., must be removed from the park on Saturday hight, (or before 10am on Sunday - if Lara Seaver from WPOR (774-4561) ok's the Sunday removal). Remember, on


