With the issuance of this permit, the owner, builder or their designee is required to provide adequate notice to the city of Portland Inspections Services for the following inspections. Appointments must be requested 48 to 72 hours in advance of the required inspection. The inspection date will need to be confirmed by this office.

- **Please read the conditions of approval that is attached to this permit!! Contact this office if you have any questions.**
- **Permits expire in 6 months. If the project is not started or ceases for 6 months.**
- **If the inspection requirements are not followed as stated below additional fees may be incurred due to the issuance of a "Stop Work Order" and subsequent release to continue.**
- **Per Section 107.3.1 of the Maine Uniform Building and Energy Code (MUBEC). One set of printed approved stamped construction documents shall be kept at the site of work and shall be open to inspection by building officials.**

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) All tents shall meet the flame propagation performance criteria contained in NFPA 701. A certificate or other evidence of acceptance by an organization acceptable to the AHJ shall serve as evidence that the tent fabric materials have the required flame propagation performance. 2) Tents shall have an approved fire resistant rating and maintain 10' between stake lines. No smoking or open flame allowed within 10'. Provide at least one 2A:10 BC fire extinguisher. 3) If the sides of the tents are to be enclosed at least two remotely located and marked exits shall be provided. 4) Fuel-fired heating equipment and propane tanks shall be installed outside of the tents and not within 5 feet of the tents or an exit discharge. 5) Cooking within the tents has not been reviewed and approved.
