With the issuance of this permit, the owner, builder or their designee is required to provide adequate notice to the city of Portland Inspections Services for the following inspections. Appointments must be requested 48 to 72 hours in advance of the required inspection. The inspection date will need to be confirmed by this office.

- **Permits expire in 6 months. If the project is not started or ceases for 6 months.**
- **If the inspection requirements are not followed as stated below additional fees may be incurred due to the issuance of a "Stop Work Order" and subsequent release to continue.**

If the repair deviates from initial recommendations and additional work is necessary, an amendment to the permit will be required. 2) Penetrations through fire resistance rated assemblies shall be protected by an approved penetration firestop system installed as tested in accordance with ASTM E814 or UL 1479 3) Separate permits are required for any electrical, plumbing, sprinkler, fire alarm, HVAC systems, heating appliances, including pellet/wood stoves, commercial hood exhaust systems and fuel tanks. Separate plans may need to be submitted for approval as a part of this process. 4) This permit is approved based upon information provided by the applicant or design professional. Marking of Means of Egress shall be provided according to NFPA 101 7.10. unless otherwise permitted by 19.2.10.2, 19.2.10.3 or 19.2.10.4. 3) Shall comply with 2009 NFPA 101 Chapter 19 Existing Health Care Occupancies Shall comply with 2009 NFPA 1 Chapter 20.4 Health Care Occupancies. All construction shall comply with City Code Chapter 10. http://www.portlandmaine.gov/citycode/chapter010.pdf 4) Any Fire alarm or Sprinkler systems shall be reviewed by a licensed contractor(s) for code compliance. A separate Fire Alarm Permit is required for new systems; or for work effecting more than 5 fire alarm devices; or replacement of a fire alarm panel with a different model. This review does not include approval of fire alarm system design or installation. A separate Suppression System Permit is required for all new suppression systems or sprinkler work effecting more than 20 heads. This review does not include approval of sprinkler system design or installation. 5) Through-penetrations and membrane penetrations in fire walls, fire barrier walls, and fire resistance rated horizontal assemblies shall be protected by firestop systems or devices in conformance with NFPA 101:8.3.5 (ASTM E 814 or ANSI/UL 1479). Providing firestop labels at each firestop system or device and an onsite manual containing the detail for each firestop system or device used for the project will streamline final inspection approvals. 6) Shall comply with 2009 NFPA 1 Chapter 16 Safeguards During Building Construction, Alteration, and Demolition Operations. Any cutting and welding done will require a Hot Work Permit from Fire Department.
