Hi Tuck,

I am hoping that there will be NO impact/changes to the 3 current entrances to my property from D St. . If there are it will impose a financial hardship on my business so please forward plans to me and David Jones . David is at DJones@JBGH.com. If your office plans any changes to existing access to my property please schedule a meeting with me and David so we may initiate a discussion of the legal/financial ramifications of your suggestions so that I can start the process of defending my business status quo which currently works well for me.

On a related subject elimination of 13 parking spaces on St John St will have a considerable negative impact on my business and rental properties there. The City code 14-282 (Me Med Overlay Zone) pledges to "alleviate parking pressure on surrounding neighborhoods". Before I am able to take anything you, as a representative of the organization which put this code together ostensibly to help BOTH Me Med and the neighborhood which is being impacted by their (to the neighbors) unwelcome presence here, seriously, please tell me (us neighbors), how it is the City of Portland proposes to accomplish this when it is currently going in just the opposite direction. This is in spite of ALL the property owners being impacted by this decision having attended all meetings on the subject, writing letters to the newspaper and other complaining which has been totally imgored by the City and Me Med. If it is the intention of your office to continue going in an adversarial direction to the interests of my business(s) here by restricting current access to my property on D St. I would need to meet you only in company of council.

I look forward to hearing some positive news from you albeit "t'aint likely".

Thanks so much. I look forward to hearing back from you.

BTW, we few abutters are really the only parties directly impacted by this project. I think the project was initiated for this neighborhood only about a year ago when the overlay zoning was created. It was attempted to be located elsewhere earlier but the neighbors were able to nix it. There has been next to no opportunity to actually offer input to this process (I recieved notice of one Me Med public meeting and the planning board (3 minutes per individual) public comment meeting after which construction began immediately. I/we are dependent upon the reasonableness of any public process to assure us it this project will not have a negative impact on us. When I see language in the overlay zone doc which says that parking pressure on surrounding neighborhoods will be alleviated I feel I have no need to intervene. When I see that the plan threatens to do the opposite of what is intended by the plan's language ,REMOVE nearly all of my existing parking, I am going to react. Now I am hearing that the "plan" may threaten to change existing access to my property. We are not staring off on a very good foot here are we? Well you signed up for this; so I hope you can make me happy.

Thanks for staying in touch even if I am touchy on this sensitive subject.
