

 - Healthy Communities










TRADITIONAL PATIENT ROOMS

TRADITIONAL LINEAL ٠ PATIENT ROOM ARRANGEMENT




MODIFIED PATIENT ROOMS

Perkins+Will

1. POINT CITY

by introducing new transportation points, MMC strengthens pedestrian walk-ability and public circulation - bus stop is located at the front of building.

2. BIKE STORAGE

outdoor and indoor bike storage available on site.

3. HIGH PERFORMANCE ENVELOPE

well insulated exterior glazings help to prevent heat transfer and reduce heat loss.

4. CONGRESS GROUND FLOOR GLAZING

transparent glazing allows for natural daylighting to luminate concourse.



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5. PV-READY ROOF

roof structure allows for addition of PV-Panels, cut building energy usage and provide roof shading.

6. EFFICIENT LED LIGHTING energy efficient, long lasting fixtures.

7. LOW FLOW PLUMBING FIXTURES reduce water usage and conserve water.

8. EFFICIENT SYSTEMS use less energy to heat and cool the building.

9. WHITE ROOF MEMBRANE helps to reduce heat island effect.

10. HEALTHY MATERIALS


improve indoor air quality and reduce exposure to harsh chemicals in materials.

11. RECYCLING ALCOVE

staffs have easy access to sustainable waste management.

12. ROOF GARDENS/ IMPERVIOUS SURFACE

decrease rate of flow into sewer, reduce storm water runoff, and improve thermo insulation.

- Safety






Contractor Parking

- Language to be included in all subcontracts with offsite parking requirements and penalties for non-compliance






Construction Timeline



MMC Campus Replacement & Modernization Project

Maine Medical Center is excited to begin work on the largest modernization and replacement project in its history – a patient-focused initiative that will enable the state's largest hospital to meet the most urgent healthcare needs well into the future.

Altogether, the \$525 million project will create 128 new private patient rooms, add 19 procedure rooms for surgeries and other complex treatments, provide an additional 225 spaces for patient and visitor parking, and consolidate MMC employee parking into one nearby garage that will meet current demand and future growth. The project will also open Maine Medical
