REQUIRED BICYCLE PARKING:

20 BIKE SPACES FOR THE FIRST 100 VEHICLE SPACES = 20 SPACES
3,825 TOTAL VEHICLE SPACES – 100 = 3,725 / 1 BIKE PER 20 VEHICLES = 186 BICYCLE SPACES


