Hi Nell – The following is a status update of previous comments based upon new information submitted by the applicant. Thanks

General

- Provide durations for each phase. Provided. I have no further comment
- Install W11-2 warning signs at the Congress Street temporary crosswalk. Incorporated. I have no further comment
- What role will the flaggers have on CMP? Information provided. I have no further comment
- · Add share the road signs for bicyclists. Incorporated. I have no further comment
- Please note if Bus stops are impacted. It is noted that coordination may be required. Planning for changes should begin now
- Will the work zone obstruct sight lines to pedestrians in temporary crosswalk? The applicant notes that none is expected. This should be confirmed in the field
- What is meant by alternative flow on Gilman Street? Is this just for the last phase? Clarified. I have no further comment

Phase 1A

• Provide taper calculations for lane shifts (for all phases). Provided. I have no further comment

Phase 1B

- Conflicting signs exiting garage on Forest should be addressed. Incorporated. I have no further comment.
- Could a few of the on-street parking spaces be returned for use in front of Salvage BBQ. To be determined in the field. I find this acceptable with the understanding that parking should be returned when feasible.

Phase 1C

- Seems like some on-street parking could be allowed. To be determined in the field. I find this acceptable
- Confirm ADA width requirements are met on Forest due to pole constraints. Notes that it is 4-foot and will be field checked. I find this acceptable, but it should be acknowledged that all facilities shall meet ADA requirements

Phase 2A/2A-1

- Is the sidewalk closed on the north side of Congress at Gilman? Clarified. I have no further comment
- How is traffic being managed on Gilman between the closure and Park Avenue? Greater detail is required. This
 needs more detail. Is parking being removed? Conflicting signs need to be addressed (e.g. one-way at Park). How
 are truck deliveries/activity being managed?

Phase 2C

• I am concerned about pedestrians crossing on Congress Street west of Gilman, where multiple lanes and barrels are provided. Greater detail or adjustment is suggested. Plan has been modified. This should be reviewed in the field and may need to be provided at Gilman if unsafe pedestrian routes occur.

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
