Jodie just follow up with the approved FAA information for the new Congress Street building. Please find attached a copy of the FAA finding. Per the attached information the FAA has determined the height of the new building does not pose any impact to any air traffic. As in indicated below we are a ways off from being able to submit for a FAA permit or the cranes associated with the project as the crane selection is a function of how the structure will be constructed which will not be determined until we have contracted with a structural steel fabricator and erection subcontractor. It will most likely be several months until the final decision is made.

Jodi thank you for the information pertaining to your ongoing review of the new Maine Medical Center project. Attached please find a PDF copy of the FAA filing for the permanent ANE filing for the building. The filing for the new building should for the most part be academic as the height of the Congress Tower is lower than the surrounding existing structures on site.

With regards to the FAA permit for the tower cranes associated with project they are not currently scheduled to be installed until August of 2021 (over a year away). Additionally at this time we do not have a Structural steel subcontractor assigned to the project or a crane selected all of which need to happen before a FAA crane permit can be filed for.

The Maine Medical Center legal department is currently working on all of the encroachments which I assume Nell is part of.
