Dear Mr. Fisk,

An evaluation of the above reference property on 3/1/2012, shows that the structure fails to comply with Chapter 6 Article V of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Portland, The Housing Code. Attached is a list of the violations.

This is a notice of violation pursuant to Section 6-118 of the Code. All referenced violations shall be corrected within 10 days of the date of this notice. A re-inspection of the premises will occur on 3/26/2012 at which time compliance will be required. Failure to comply will result in this office referring the matter to the City of Portland Corporate Counsel for legal action and possible civil penalties, as provided for in Section 1-15 of the Code.

This constitutes an appealable decision pursuant to Section 6-127 of the Code.

Please be advised that the Portland City Council has amended the Building regulations to include a \$75.00 re-inspection fee. This violation will automatically cause a re-inspection at no charge. If there are any subsequent inspections, however, the \$75.00 fee will be assessed for each.

1. RODENT HARBORAGE/ VACANT-City Ord. § 22-3 (b)

The owner of the Building shall maintain the building and the lot on which the building is located free from any accumulation of any putrid substance, garbage, rubbish, old lumber, debris or rubble, except in watertight covered containers.

Violation: Two uncovered and overfilled garbage cans present at rear of property. One 5 gallon pail with unknown substance in it. Various wrappers, food packages and bags strewn about property.

2. PROPERTY TO BE SECURED IF-City Ord. § 6-124.

If the owner or operator of any property which has been condemned as unfit for habitation does not proceed to make the necessary corrections to bring the property into compliance with the provisions of this article, such owner or operator shall proceed to make the property safe and secure so that no danger to life or property or fire hazard shall exist.

Violation: Property is not secure. There is evidence that vagrants are occupying the structure.
