To Whom It May Concern:

In my capacity as the Zoning Administrator for the City of Portland, I hereby certify that the following is true:

- 1. The principal structure on the Property along with a portion of the parking lot is located within a B-2b business zone. It is noted that another portion of the accessory parking lot is located within an R-6 residential zone. The Property is also affected by a Historic Overlay zone.
- 2. The property is a lawfully created parcel according to applicable subdivision laws, including 30-A, M.R.S.A. § 4401, et seq., and regulations and ordinances adopted pursuant thereto, including the Portland Code.

- 3. To the best of my knowledge, there are no current zoning, subdivision, land use or code violations of record in the City of Portland concerning the Property.
- 4. The Property was approved and developed with two appeals. On October 3, 1996 the Zoning Board of Appeals granted a variance to grant relief from the impervious surface coverage requirement. The Zoning Board of Appeals also granted a miscellaneous appeal concerning the requirement that parking be within 100 feet from the principal building. Copies of such appeals are included with this letter.
- 5. Based on the Certificates of Occupancy, the buildings and structures on the Property complied with all other dimensional requirements (area, width, or depth of land as a building site for the structure; floor space area of the structure; setback of the structure from the property lines of the land; height of the structure) of the Portland Code at the time they were constructed and are not required to comply with current dimensional and parking requirements.
- 6. The current uses of the Property, thirty-six (36) dwelling units and office space, comply with the current use regulations of the Portland Code.
