With relation to the anti-panic hardware on the vestibule door at St. Louis Parish Hall at 279 Danforth St., I phoned the lady who talked with you at 2-0185, which is the Insurance Company where she works, her first name or nickname being Tony and her last name Italian. I told her that if the Parish insists, we will go along as a trial measure with this door equipped with self-closing hinges or a liquid door closer and no other locks or fastenings or latches of any description being on the door. However, I recommended that they put on the anti-panic hardware because that would certainly meet the needs. She was told that we have had trouble in such cases in that someone would attach to the door bolts or hooks or some other fastening which might defeat the purpose of the Safety Law if it should be fastened in time of panic: that whoever put on such a fastening would be liable in case of disaster, and that if we found any such fastenings on the door, the license would be jeopardized, and they would immediately have to put on the anti-panic hardware.

She was also reminded that the cost of either suitable self-closing hinges or door closer would represent a considerable portion of the cost of the anti-panic hardware actually specified by law.

They are to decide and go ahead on one course or the other, and notify us for inspection.

Gentlemen:

The application to the Municipal Officers of Portland by St. Louis Parish for approval of a license to play bingo in the St. Louis Parish House at 279 Danforth St., has come to me as one of the Enforcement Officers under the Public Assemblage Ordinance of Portland.

Our Public Assemblage Inspector has looked the building over and finds the following improvements necessary to comply with that part of the Public Assemblage Ordinance which comes under the jurisdiction of this department. Please have these improvements made and notify this office for another inspection, so, if all is in order, we may approve the application.

1. Remove from the rear exit door a certain hook and eye which has been attached to the door, evidently to provide more security, and adjust the door so that it opens easily when pressure is applied to the anti-panic hardware. It is not allowable to have any locks or fastenings of any description on this door at any time, other than the anti-panic hardware.
2. Provide anti-panic latch with crash bar clear across the width of the door, on the "working" door of the pair between the assembly hall and the front vestibule, this being the door on the left as one leaves the assembly hall. The intent of this requirement is that at any time persons in the assembly hall may operate this three foot wide door freely by pressing against the anti-panic bar.
3. Provide a standard exit light over the rear exit doors showing toward the assembly hall, this light to be controlled by the same switch as controls the existing white light outside of the rear door, and the switch to be marked "exit lights". A standard exit light is one which has letters in the word exit no less than four and one-half inches high and showing red when the interior light is burning.
