Dear Sir:

We are issuing to H. G. Cousins a permit to cover installing a heating plant in the building at 272 Panforth St. (rear).

An inspector from this office reports certain conditions in and around the chimney to which this heater is to be connected that require definite attention before the heater is installed, or, at least before a fire is built in it.

The masonry of the chimney from the bottom up to a point about one foot below the first floor joists is in bad shape, and it appears doubtful if the masonry may be properly repaired by merely repairing the joints. Probably it will be found necessary to replace the lower part of the chimney with sound masonry, in which case a tile lining is required in the portion rebuilt, and a permit should be secured from this department before the work is commenced.

It will also be necessary for you to provide a cast iron cleanout door and frame as close to the bottom of the chimney flue as possible, and to clean out the flue thoroughly.

The wood of a girder and one floor joist under the first floor is directly against or very close to the walls of the chimney. The girder rests on brick corbelling from the chimney, and the brickwork has cracked. It will be necessary to make adjustment so the this wood will be at least one inch from the chimney walls, and the timbers properly supported by heading off or other suitable means. It is probably best to remove this brick corbelling, and support the girder at this point with an iron pipe column at least 4 inches in outside diameter.

Please correct all of these features on or before Sept. 25, 1936 and before any fire is built in the new furnace.

Mr. Cousins: Please do not connect the smokepipe until these matters are taken care of.

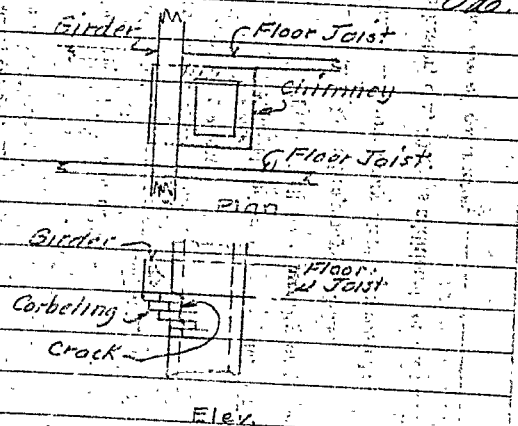
