Dear Sir:

The new work in connection with the installation of an oil burner in your building at 581 Benford Street meets the requirements, but two conditions which existed prior to this new work are called to your attention as not being considered good practice for safety according to the best authority.

The vent pipe from the tank which existed is three-quarter inch. The minimum now considered safe for venting purposes is one and one-quarter inch.

A more dangerous condition, however, is that the oil gauge on the tank is of breakable glass. In case this gauge should be broken, as might occur without anyone realizing it, a great deal, if not all, of the oil in the tank would run out on the floor creating both a disagreeable and hazardous condition.

The Building Code does not require that these two features be changed to comply with present day requirements, but this letter is sent to call your attention to both of them with the hope that at least the gauge will be changed.
