Dear Mr. Leja:

A food service license inspection of your establishment, Union Station Café, was conducted on February 12, 2009. This inspection was attended by Mike Menario, two police officers and myself. The purpose of this inspection was to follow up on an attempted inspection by Mr. Menario on February 10, 2009. Inspector Menario attempted to perform an inspection of your establishment on that date. During that inspection, you became verbally aggressive and physically aggressive in your behavior. You demanded he leave your establishment immediately. Based on our conversation today regarding your actions that occurred on February 10, 2009, you acknowledged you were verbally aggressive during that inspection. You also stated you may have brushed up against Inspector Menario and may have bumped into him when he attempted to exit the Café.

This is to reiterate my conversation with you that verbal or physical aggression during any inspection activities that occur at your establishment in the future will result in the City Official immediately leaving your premises and failing the establishment due to an inability to perform an inspection. By City Code §15-14.5, City Officials have the right to enter your establishment for the purposes of licensure and inspections. Section 15-14.5 reads:

Section 15-14.5. Inspections. States: (b) A licensee must allow access to the licensed premises to any city official authorized to determine compliance with federal, state or city law at any reasonable time, including any time that access is allowed to the public.

(c) A violation of this section is grounds for license non-renewal, suspension, or revocation, in addition any other penalties authorized by this code.

At the present, you do not have a license to operate in the City of Portland. Section 15-3 of the Ordinance requires a current license for operation within the City of Portland and you license is no longer valid. Per our discussion today, you must submit your application for license renewal and pay all applicable fees by Friday February 13, 2009. Please be advised that a re-inspection fee of \$75.00 will be required to be paid before the Clerks office will issue your license.
