A total of thirteen (13) plants are within the affected area...Two (2) White Spruce were planted already, as well as, Five (5) hedge plants. Three (3) Northern Bayberry, Two (2) Winterberry, and One (1) Beach Plum are the additional proposed plants to be planted within the affected area. Based on spacing and growth of each variety, additional plants are outside the area in close vicinity. (five (5) additional Beach Plums.

ACE removed a massive growth of invasive honeysuckle, I cannot determine number of individual plants. Per email from Ann Machado, an area of 1200sf is to be restored. Attached, I have designated the area where the honeysuckle was located, on the first page. The second page, was/is color coded with shape icons to show what we have already planted, and what is intended/proposed to be planted. ALL are described in the Legend (right side). I have now added the required 2 gallon reference for each proposed plant, and the numbers of each variety in the Legend, as well.
