Yes, we have made a lot of progress!

We began by immediately reconstructing the rear stairway of the building as per the plans, which required that a new addition be added to the top of the building. In addition, the area that leads from the 3rd floor apartment to the rear stairway was sheet-rocked and re-floored. In addition, the wooden bead board paneling was removed from the rear entry area and replaced with sheetrock. This was completed (except for minor cosmetic work) shortly after we got the building permit in June of 2012. The cost of this whole thing was over \$30,000, which wiped me out financially, but it is done. [That required me to yank my daughter out of McAuley H.S. and put her back into public school, so my whole family sacrificed to get that project done!]

Before calling the City back for the final inspection, I need to complete the remainder of the work (e.g. widening the third floor front stairs by 6 inches and making it less steep) which is going to be a major, major project affecting the downstairs apartments as well, and I'm just trying to save the funds to do it.

I am also saving money to have the fire doors installed everywhere and I am planning to get that project done this winter. I have a phone call in to my contractor to get that work scheduled over the winter months. To me, that is a higher priority (and much easier to do) than widening the third floor front stairs by 6 inches so I was planning to do the fire doors next. (And we already put one in the new addition discussed above.)

This is not on your list, but I was also planning to call my electrician to have him check every single smoke detector to make sure they are in good working order and to replace any that are old or out of date.

My other building badly needs to be painted so I'm trying to work that into all of this as well. That's going to cost at least \$20,000 and the paint is literally peeling off in sheets so it needs to be done in the Spring.

I greatly appreciate your continued patience and working with me as I continue to make progress on this. I just learned last week that my mother (in Philadelphia) has advanced stage metastacized ovarian cancer and I will have to be spending large amounts of time travelling back and forth to Philadelphia to see to her care as I am her only child and her only close relative. So your continued patience would be very much appreciated. Unlike many landlords that I'm sure you deal with, I am responsive, caring and committing to getting everything done – it only takes some time and patience on all of our parts

Thank you for your many years of service to the City and I wish you all the best in your retirement.
