

HVAC Permit application narrative: Eric Hamlin Fireplace insert installation at 90 Hartley Street
– CBL 136 B017001

I plan to have two Regency Fireplace Products Liberty model LR14E natural gas fireplace inserts installed into existing masonry (brick) fireplaces. One will be installed in the ground floor living room and one in the basement as indicated on the attached sketches. Each unit has an output of between 22,000 and 31,000 BTU's, and each will be installed with dual metal factory-built flue liners – one for fresh air intake and one for exhaust gases. Each fireplace has its own flue in the masonry chimney, so each flue will contain one pair of liners. The third flue was previously used for an oil fired boiler and was fitted with a stainless steel liner, but this is currently unused and capped. Nothing else will share any of the flues.

The installer does not use email, so I provided a paper copy of the application for him to sign and that was scanned and emailed back to me. Project cost totals differ because a manufacturer promotion was applied to the project after I printed the form for signature. The installation will be done by Propane and Natural Gas Technician Nathan B. Leavitt (License #PNT3872).

Included with the application are:

1. Sketches showing the locations of each unit.
2. A page from the owner's manual showing basic specifications and safety listings.
3. Installer information from the Maine Fuel Board Web site.
4. Fast Track Schedule B.
5. Duplicate signature page of the application form with installer signature.
6. Updated invoice showing total cost of project (\$6748.72) after the promo was applied. I based the permit cost on the project total rounded up to \$7,000.
