Hi Lindsey -

Our team has reviewed the Oak Consulting Group plan dated Nov. 27,2017 and has these comments:

- 1. Your contractor will be required to obtain a Street Opening permit from DPW prior to activity; they must be licensed by the City. Rhonda Zazzara is copied, she can help with details regarding this permitting program. We will waive the \$1000 winter moratorium fee as this plan does not intend to disrupt any portion of the streets themselves.
- 2. Please add Winter Erosion Control measures as notes to this plan; a pdf of typical measures is attached. Oak Consulting should consider customizing it for this plan.
- 3. The 6 bollards placed by DPW as a safety measure must be returned in good condition; Kevin Thomas is copied as your contact for that task.
- 4. The newly restored grassed area on your property MUST be surrounded by a visual barrier system until such time as significant regrowth has occurred. I suggest grade stakes and flagging or caution tape; it doesn't have to be fancy but must be functional to prevent anyone from driving (or plowing) over that area. No snow storage can occur on that restored area.
- 5. Sawcutting the paved area must leave a clean edge to the sidewalk, and loam placement must create a 'seamless' transition.
- 6. Elevation of sidewalk and restored area must be suitable for proper drainage; no ponding/icing within the sidewalk can be created by this work.
