FYI - I made contact with Lindsey Kelloway today; we spoke about the measures this site owner will be taking "soon" to address the violation matters.

## Steps include:

- 1. She will engage Oak Consulting to revise the site modifications drawing sent previously and supply it to DPW at a minimum; possibly also Zoning.
- 2. They will engage a contractor to take three specific actions; they are:
- A. Remove the single pavement marking in front parking area closest to Hartley St. to discourage parking on the sidewalk zone.
- B. Remove the newly installed pavement and reseed / install winter erosion mix along the side of the building, & also reseed / install winter erosion mix to re-establish the esplanade between rear parking area and Hartley Street.
- C. Install a curb stop (rubberized 'bumper' style) along rear lot parking stall to re-establish safe sidewalk zone along Hartley Street.

Lindsey indicted she expects to get back to me late this week with a timeline; she knows they will have to get an Occupancy Permit if they need to do work impacting use of the sidewalk zone. It's unlikely they'll need an Excavation permit as they expect to perform all such work on private property.

Can someone supply me with the final version of the second NOV that went out in October please? I can't seem to find it in my myriad of e-mails.

Anne - they certainly did not meet the 30-day condition in that NOV.
