QUITCLAIM DEED

THE STATE OF MAINE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, VETERANS AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT successor in interest to the STATE OF MAINE, acting by and through the Acting Adjutant General pursuant to 37-B M.R.S.A. § 264, (the "Grantor"), FOR CONSIDERATION PAID, grants to the UNIVERSITY OF NEW ENGLAND, a Maine non-profit corporation, whose mailing address is 716 Stevens Avenue Portland, ME 04103 (the "Grantee"), certain real property, together with any improvements thereon, located at 760-780 Stevens Avenue, in the City of Portland, County of Cumberland and State of Maine, more particularly describes as follows:

A certain lot or parcel of land with the buildings thereon situated on the westerly side of Stevens Avenue in the City of Portland in said County of Cumberland and State of Maine, being the same premises conveyed by Elizur B. Forbes to Portland and Forest Avenue Rail Road Company by deed dated March 22, 1864, and recorded in Cumberland County Registry of Deeds in Book 326, Page 212, in which deed said premises were bounded as follows:

"A certain parcel of land fronting on the principal street at Stevens's Plains in Westbrook aforesaid, bounded as follows; beginning on said street at the southeast corner of land formerly of Jeremiah Beedle, now of Woodbury Polleys; thence running North sixty-four and a half degrees West five hundred seven and a half feet; thence North twenty-five and a half degrees East, thirty three feet; thence North sixty-three degrees West one hundred twenty-five feet; thence South seventy-five degrees forty-five minutes West seven hundred twenty feet; thence South sixty-four degrees east nine hundred ten and a half feet; thence North twenty and a quarter degrees east one hundred forty and a half feet; thence South sixty-six and a half degrees east, three hundred twenty four feet to the street or Stevens's Plains road before mentioned; thence North (by the line of the Street) nineteen degrees and three quarters east, two hundred ninety feet to the place of beginning - estimated to contain about nine and one quarter acres."

Meaning and intending to convey the same premises delineated on the Plan of Property in Portland, Maine made for the Adjutant General, Augusta, Maine prepared by H.I. & E.C. Jordan dated August 22, 1958.

For Grantor's source of title see: Warranty Deed from Portland Rail Road Company to the State of Maine dated October 14, 1940 and recorded at the York County Registry of Deeds in Book 1619, Page 299.

By his signature hereon, the Acting Adjutant General certifies that the premises being conveyed in compliance with 37-B MRSA § 264, Section 6, Subsection 5 constitutes the Portland Armory, that he has designated an officer to inspect the premises, that he has determined the property to be unfit for military use, and has condemned the premises and furthermore that the premises are not being sold for less than appraised value as determined by a person licensed as a real estate appraiser under Title 32, chapter 123 and that the State of Maine Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management is the successor in interest to the State Military Defense Commission of the State of Maine.

The personally appeared the above-named Brigadier General Gerard F. Bolduc, The Acting Adjutant General of the Maine National Guard, and acknowledged the foregoing instrument to be his free act and deed and, pursuant to authorization of the Maine Legislature as found in 37-B M.R.S.A. § 264, the free act and deed of the State of Maine.
