I know that you are familiar with this area as you have reviewed this in the past eight years. I am the resident of 10 Willow Lane, and I have ongoing issues with the abutter of 73 Powland Street. I would like to set up a meeting with you to discuss the ongoing concerns that I have with STJ, INC (an abutter whom doesn't own nor have rights to the culvert) / Gorham Sand and Gravel taking upon themselves to complete work in shore land zoning, and RPZ zone without any proper permits. It's obvious that there is "additional intrusion into the natural resource" as you can't put a new culvert, storm water, grate, crushed stone, as well as pump water from CMPs property onto the City property without any intrusion.

Please call me at 207-409-9307, and forward me Federal regulations pertaining to my environmental concerns.

All exempt activities under NRPA are listed here and remain exempt, as long as exemption standards are followed. I did not see erosion issues at the site today and from my understanding the appropriate protocols were in place for repairing the culvert. I met with a representative from Gorham Sand and Gravel as well as the Pan Am railway construction inspector.
