Hi Christina -

The landscape planting proposed will shift slightly to recover the pond access road. The five new trees shown will fill the gap, overall the plant numbers proposed should adequately meet standards. The Willow trees that are defective, will be replaced with Tupelo trees, we have discussed with landowner who agrees with the native tree plant type.

As with these types of projects, we retain ability at the completion of the project to 'adjust' landscape / tree planting including additions as part of contingency provisions. I feel comfortable with the plan as shown. It would be good if we can visit the site as the project evolves.

In review of the current plan, this should be adequate, it shows shading where the plants are going vs exact spaces and the five trees able to close the space.
