1.1 SUMMARY

1.2 WORK COVERED BY CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- A. Project Identification: Project consists of construction of the new Portland International Jetport: Secure Exit Portal
 - 1. Project Location: Portland, Maine.
- B. Owner: Portland International Jetport.

This project consists of select demolition and the construction of a new secure exit portal, with support spaces (including but not limited to a Security Control Room and a Storage Room), on the second floor of the existing terminal. Construction will include building new walls, including a glazed storefront wall system, new ceilings, new flooring, electrical & mechanical work, and the installation of security access & surveillance equipment, as well as pedestrian control devices. Also included is the enclosure of an existing escalator. Additional new carpeting and new ceiling tile are identified throughout the Mezzanine area of the second floor.

1.3 TYPE OF CONTRACT

A. Project will be constructed under a single prime contract.

1.4 OWNER-FURNISHED PRODUCTS

1.5 USE OF PREMISES

A. General: Contractor shall have limited use of premises for construction operations as indicated on Drawings by the Contract limits.

- B. Use of Site: Limit use of premises to areas within the Contract limits indicated. Do not disturb portions of Project site beyond areas in which the Work is indicated.
 - 1. Owner Occupancy: Allow for Owner occupancy of areas immediately proximate to Project site.

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- 2. Driveways and Entrances: Keep driveways loading areas, and entrances serving premises clear and available to Owner, Owner's employees, and emergency vehicles at all times. Do not use these areas for parking or storage of materials.
 - a. Schedule deliveries to minimize use of driveways and entrances.
 - b. Schedule deliveries to minimize space and time requirements for storage of materials and equipment on-site.
- C. Use of Existing Building: Do not interfere with existing operations of the building. Repair damage caused by construction operations. Take all precautions necessary to protect the building and its occupants during the construction period.
- D. Time Restrictions for Performing Interior and Exterior Work: Monday through Friday; 7 am to 5 p.m., unless arrangements are made with the Owner prior to the start of work.
 - 1. Provide 24 hour notice to Owner when performing work other than normal working hours.

1.6 OWNER'S OCCUPANCY REQUIREMENTS

- A. Partial Owner Occupancy: Owner will occupy the premises during entire construction period, with the exception of areas under construction. Cooperate with Owner during construction operations to minimize conflicts and facilitate Owner usage. Perform the Work so as not to interfere with Owner's operations. Maintain existing exits, unless otherwise indicated.
 - 1. Maintain access to existing walkways, corridors, and other adjacent occupied or used facilities. Do not close or obstruct walkways, corridors, or other occupied or used facilities without written permission from Owner and authorities having jurisdiction.
 - 2. Provide not less than 72 hours' notice to Owner of activities that will affect Owner's operations.

1.7 SPECIFICATION FORMATS AND CONVENTIONS

- A. Specification Format: The Specifications are organized into Divisions and Sections using the pre 2004 16-division format and CSI/CSC's "MasterFormat" numbering system.
 - Section Identification: The Specifications use section numbers and titles to help crossreferencing in the Contract Documents. Sections in the Project Manual are in numeric sequence; however, the sequence is incomplete. Consult the table of contents at the beginning of the Project Manual to determine numbers and names of sections in the Contract Documents.
- B. Specification Content: The Specifications use certain conventions for the style of language and the intended meaning of certain terms, words, and phrases when used in particular situations. These conventions are as follows:
 - 1. Abbreviated Language: Language used in the Specifications and other Contract Documents is abbreviated. Words and meanings shall be interpreted as appropriate. Words implied, but not stated, shall be inferred as the sense requires. Singular words

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- shall be interpreted as plural, and plural words shall be interpreted as singular where applicable as the context of the Contract Documents indicates.
- 2. Imperative mood and streamlined language are generally used in the Specifications. Requirements expressed in the imperative mood are to be performed by Contractor. Occasionally, the indicative or subjunctive mood may be used in the Section Text for clarity to describe responsibilities that must be fulfilled indirectly by Contractor or by others when so noted.
 - a. The words "shall," "shall be," or "shall comply with," depending on the context, are implied where a colon (:) is used within a sentence or phrase.
- C. References to Related Sections: This paragraph lists only products, construction, and equipment that the reader might expect to find in this Section but are specified elsewhere. This is not meant to be a continuation of a list of work included in each section.
