This statement should be considered in addition to our prior letters to the Planning Board, Zoning Board of Appeals and City Council from January, May, July, September, October and December 2015.

The Stroudwater Village Association is grateful that the Council and Planning office have elected to begin a broader conversation about land use in the Stroudwater area, beginning January 2016. What we all need now is sufficient time for that discussion to take place.

As we have expressed throughout this process, the Stroudwater Village Association remains opposed to one-off changes of use for individual parcels in the neighborhood area, until such a comprehensive visioning process for the area is completed.

The SVA was very interested to read the memorandum entitled "1945 Congress Street Zone Change Application Supplemental Information" from Jeff Levine, Director of Planning to the Council, dated 1/8/2016 (tab 6, pp. 62-76 in the full 1/20/2016 Council agenda packet), especially the white paper entitled "Outer Congress Street Land Use" that begins on pp 72. Mr. Levine's analysis is thoughtful and represents a great first step that could lead to a broader, generally-understood vision for the area.

Stroudwater residents will, we are sure, be willing and excited to help be a productive part of that larger discussion. And in fact the SVA has several existing upcoming forums, such as our annual Pancake Breakfast in February and Annual Meeting in May, in which we would be delighted to host conversations on this subject. SVA members would also be happy to participate in other forums.

Unfortunately, our challenge this week remains that there are currently two meaningful decisions before the City that represent a de facto implementation of a vision, before we have all collectively had a chance to discuss such a vision in the first place. The first is Northland's 1945 Congress Street re-zoning proposal application (before the City Council on 1/20), and the second is Verizon Wireless' 1877 Congress Street Conditional Use application (before the Zoning Board of Appeals on 1/21). As everyone is aware, both of these specific proposals are already controversial in isolation, but are especially so when considered together and in advance of the discussion we reference above.

Neither decision is a time-sensitive issue from the City's perspective, nor is either decision the result of advocacy from existing residents. As such, these decisions should be at a minimum tabled, or the applications should be rejected at this time.

As we have expressed throughout this process, the Stroudwater Village Association remains opposed to one-off changes of use for individual parcels in the neighborhood area, until a comprehensive visioning process for the area is completed.
