MEMO

Thank you for requesting a field determination and meeting me on May 8th at 1789 Congress Street. After inspecting the area I have determined that a Section 8 (shoreline stabilization) Permit by Rule from the Department would be necessary for you to stabilize two eroded banks on your property if you use native vegetation and natural materials. I have attached an application for your use. However, if you choose to use riprap for this project it will require an Individual Natural Resources Protection Act (NRPA) permit application. I have included a NRPA permit application for your use. You may request a pre-application meeting with our licensing staff if you are unfamiliar with the permitting process. To do so, please send your request in writing to: Marybeth Richardson, Regional Licensing and Compliance Coordinator, Maine DEP, Southern Maine Regional Office, 312 Canco Road, Portland, ME 04103 or email at: Marybeth.Richardson@maine.gov. You must include your contact information (name, phone number, mailing address, and email address), project location (town), a short description of your project, a preliminary site plan, a regional map with the site marked, and photographs of the area.

We also discussed removal of a tree on your property that appeared hazardous. You were proposing to cut this tree, but not stump this tree. I referred you to the Zoning Administrator for the Portland area, Ann Machado. You may contact her at (207) 874-8709 or via email at AMACHADO@portlandmaine.gov. If you remove this tree you will need to replace it with a tree similar and native in vegetation within the shoreland zone of your property. Please make sure that all local permits, as well as applicable DEP permits, have been obtained prior to starting any work.

Erosion control devices must be installed and maintained on the project site during any soil disturbance activity. A Stormwater Management Law PBR or Maine Construction General Permit "NOI" and "NOT" must be filed with the Department if more than 1 acre of area is going to be disturbed on the project site at any given time during construction.
