Hi Beth,

Thank you for sending this information. The zoning division gives its approval for this tree to be removed without further permitting, provided that Jeff Tarling has also given the OK (I've copied him here). The stump/roots should be left in place so as to avoid soil disturbance. The Shoreland Zoning requirements do require that any trees that are removed be replaced with tree(s) of native species. Please work with Jeff to get a recommendation on species, tree specifications, etc. The planted tree should be monitored for several years and replaced if it fails to survive.
