Dear Jean:

On behalf of Portland Property Holdings, LLC, we have reviewed Tom Errico's comments dated September 17, 2014 and offer the following responses. For ease of reference, we have included your comments (italics) and our response follows.

Comment 1:

I find the site plan layout to be acceptable and I have no comment.

Response:

No response required.

Comment 2:

I find the construction plan to be acceptable with the requirement that a variable message board (s) be provided that notes use of Skyway Drive as an alternative route during construction.

Response:

The updated construction plan includes signage requirements including variable message boards and enclosed with this letter.

Comment 3:

The following are my comments regarding the improvement plan:

The applicant should note why a minimum 5-foot shoulder is not provided (Please confirm that 4-feet is the existing width that the project is matching into).

Response:

Our design matches the existing conditions of Congress Street. We maintain that a 4-foot shoulder is the appropriate shoulder width for this area.

Comment 4:

A detectible warning panel shall be installed on the easterly corner of Blueberry Road.

Response:

A detectible warning strip has been added to the plans and reflected on the enclosed Sheet C-4.0 OFF General Improvements Plan and Profile.

Comment 5:

Right-of-way boundaries on the north side of Congress Street should be provided and it should be confirmed that all activity will occur in the public right-of-way.

Response:

The ROW for the north side of Congress Street has been digitized from a plan titled "Maine Turnpike Authority, Maine Turnpike Property and Right-of-way Plan Section 1-Kittery to Portland" by HNTB Dated February 1997. The offsite plans have been revised to include this line.

Comment 6:

A method for removal of existing conflicting pavement markings shall be provided for review and approval.

Response:

The Contractor will use CJ's Fine Lines to complete the striping work and indicated they will use a cold planer to grind off the stripes on Congress St. He said he has the same one that the City uses themselves.
