1) Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarms shall be installed in each area within or giving access to bedrooms. That detection must be powered by both the electrical service (plug-in or hardwired) in the building and battery.

Hardwired photoelectric interconnected battery backup smoke alarms shall be installed in each bedroom, protecting the bedrooms, and on every level.

2) Ventilation of this space is required per ASRAE 62.2, 2007 edition.

For conditioned space- insulation shall comply with the IECC, 2009 (Maine State Energy Codes).

3) Safety Glazing for hazardous location shall comply with § R308.4 of the IRC, 2009 (MUBEC).

A code compliant emergency escape shall be provided in each bedroom§. Window sills in locations more than 72 inches from finished grade shall be a minimum of 24 inches (no higher than 44 inches) above the finished floor of the room, or in compliance with § R612.4.2

R612.2 Window sills. In dwelling units, where the opening of an operable window is located more than 72 inches above the finished grade or surface below, the lowest part of the clear opening of the window shall be a minimum of 24 inches above the finished floor of the room in which the window is located. Operable sections of windows shall not permit openings that allow passage of a 4 inch diameter sphere where such openings are located within 24 inches of the finished floor.

R310.2 Window wells. The minimum horizontal area of the window well shall be 9 square feet, with a minimum horizontal projection and width of 36 inches. The area of the window well shall allow the emergency escape and rescue opening to be fully opened.

Exception: The ladder or steps required by § R310.2.1 shall be permitted to encroach a maximum of 6 inches into the required dimensions of the window well.

4) Headers and required number of jack studs must comply with Table R502.5(1) or exterior bearing walls.

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
