I want to be sure that if AND when the Change of Use permit is issued, that it's in the name of Cumberland County Scooters & Cycles.

To answer your questions, the ceiling height is 7'10" to an accoustical ceiling.

Previously and currently, the proposed "classroom" is a retail showroom, selling motorcycle and scooter apparel.

There's a fire door that separates the shop from the showroom. This door is rated for 1 1/2

The building does not contain a sprinkler system.

We do not have any specific details regarding the class size or age of students. This is a motorcycle safety class open to anyone with a valid dri'ver's license, so they must be 16 years of age in the state of Maine.

The building is constructed out of cement blocks.

The exterior door opens out into the parking lot, at ground level without any steps and a lighted E-Gress sign above.


Our office needs more information for building permit issuance, even through there is little, if any construction the "change in use" of the space may warrant more code requirements to the existing space, see below:
