#### **Conditions:**

- 1) The revised plan dated 11/11/16 and prepared by Sebago Technics is approved with conditions. The site plan hows a crosswalk between the Allagash facility and the building iacross Industrial Way.
- 2) The applicant shall obtain all required street opening permits and other required permits from the department of Public Works prior to the start of construction.
- 3) The applicant shall install the propoed shoe box lights on private property, as shown on the plan, and the lights shall not be located within the right-of-way.
- 4) The applicant shall obtain a permit for site work only from the Department of Permitting and Inspections prior to the start of construction.
