Our Company is Assured Solar Energy, as described here at [www.assuredsolar.com](http://www.assuredsolar.com). We have been in business for over 11 years, doing both grid tied and off grid systems.

Installation of this system was overseen by Robert Taisey, owner, and holder of NABCEP Installation Certification, and electrician work was subcontracted to LM Electrical, Master electrician Lloyd May

Attached here is another copy of the component information used. These components, plus their data sheets which include all UL listed materials, and their grounding requirements, are adhered to with strict NEC code. All of our attachments are rated for a 50-60lb snow load, and 120 mph wind as per the SnapnRack Series 100 UL Listed Roof Kit. The attachments, as well as the modules and optimizers result in approximately 4lbs per square foot. To add, I've also included the configuration provided directly from SnapNRack. The Solaredge inverter is equipped with rapid shutdown. All electrical work is done by our on staff Master electrician Matthew Ferguson License # MS60018709. That should be more than is necessary for an electrical permit.

Could you please confirm that this statement will suffice to get this permit cleared for our customer Frank Toderico. We have sent this information a couple of times already to three people in the City of Portland and it's been 5 months.
