- 1) Emergency lights and exit signs are required. Emergency lights and exit signs are required to be labeled in relation to the panel and circuit and on the same circuit as the lighting for the area they serve.
- 2) Assembly and educational occupancies and uses with an occupant load of 100 or more persons required listed panic or fire exit hardware on doors serviing as a means of egress.
- 3) A separate Non-Water Based Suppression System permit is required. This review does not include approval of the suppression system design or installation.
- 4) All outstanding code violations shall be corrected prior to final inspection.
- 5) A sprinkler supervisory system shall be provided in accordance with NFPA 101, Life Safety Code, and NFPA 72, National Fire Alarm and Signaling Code. Sprinkler supervisory systems shall monitor for water flow and sprinkler supervisory signals via an approved fire alarm panel to central station. - 7) Installation of a sprinkler or fire alarm system requires a Knox Box to be installed per city ordinance.
- 8) Fire department connection shall be two 2 ½" inlets.
- 9) A copy of the required state sprinkler permit with RMS signoff shall be provided prior to the final inspection
