I just wanted to reach out to you regarding Tim Higgins single family dwelling application on Auburn Street. You are probably well aware but this is a lot that sits partially within Portland and partially within Falmouth.

Tim and I have spoken at length about our requirements in relation to the construction and how it will affected by Falmouth Zoning. His site plan demonstrates that the proposed building section located within Falmouth will meet the required setbacks for the district. Since the vast majority of the construction is located within Portland I feel comfortable with your office taking over the permit process as I believe that both towns are under the same building code cycle and there is little sense in us each doing independent reviews. I have requested from Tim that a copy of all permitting and approvals be submitted for our records at the time of issuance.
