They shall be powered by the building's electrical service with battery backup and shall be interconnected. CO alarms shall be installed in the following locations: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) Outside each separate dwelling unit sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms (2) On every occupiable level of the dwelling unit, including basements, excluding attics and crawl spaces 2) Single-station photoelectric smoke alarms are required. They shall be powered by the building's electrical service with battery backup and shall be interconnected. Smoke alarms shall be installed in the following locations: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) All sleeping rooms (2) Outside each separate sleeping area, in the immediate vicinity of the sleeping rooms (3) On each level of the dwelling unit, including basements. 3) Fuel-fired boilers shall be protected in accordance with NFPA 101, Life Safety Code.
