 - (i) Per previous review and City approval, the State of Maine Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry Natural Areas Program (MNAP), there are no known mapped significant natural features within the project site.
 - (ii) The project area has been previously reviewed and developed. No tree removal is required therefore federal and state protected bat species and other critical or threatened or endangered species are not of concern on this site.

 - (iii) Not applicable. The freezer addition location occurs within an area that is currently paved.
